

Eligibility

Any artist 18 years or older residing in or maintaining a residence in Wisconsin.

Entry Fee

\$35 jurying fee per entrant, free for RAM members. This fee covers up to two works.

Requirements and Specifications

- One or two original works made after October 1, 2022, may be entered.
- Work must be executed in an aqueous medium (for example: watercolor, acrylic, ink, or qouache). Artists may use the aqueous medium on its own or in combination with dry or mixed media. Work must consist of at least 50% aqueous media.
- The museum cannot accept works that include food, soil, or living organisms.
- All work must be on a paper surface, including 2-D, collage, book, or 3-D construction.
- Canvas, canvas panels/boards, yupo, and other non-paper surfaces are unacceptable.
- Hand-colored photographs and digitally created media are also unacceptable.
- Two-dimensional work, including the frame, must be a minimum of eight inches and a maximum of 72 inches in either direction.
- Three-dimensional work must be no larger than 72 inches high x 48 inches wide x 48 inches deep.
- Sizes outside these requirements are unacceptable.
- Work must be framed properly, glazed with glass or Plexiglas®, and wired for hanging. Sawtooth hangers are not acceptable. RAM recommends white and off-white matting. RAM reserves the right to refuse works that do not meet the museum's standards for quality, presentation, and framing.
- Work must not have been created under the direct supervision of a teacher.
- Work must not have been previously exhibited at RAM's Wustum Museum or RAM.
- Submissions must meet all requirements listed above. For further clarification on these rules regarding how they may pertain to more non-traditional artwork construction or alternative hanging methods, please contact RAM Curatorial Assistant Katelyn Mitchell before Monday, September 30.

- Submit \$35 entry fee (free for RAM members) online at ramart.org.
- Save images as .jpg, .png, or .tif files at 300 dpi resolution, at least 1800 pixels on the longest side, and with a file size no larger than 5 MB. If you do not feel confident in your photography/photo editing skills, or if you feel that your work cannot be accurately portrayed in one image, you may find it more beneficial to drop off your work in person.
- Follow instructions and complete registration forms at **ramart.org**.
- Retain **Identification Labels** to attach to work in the event it is accepted.

Valuation of Submitted Work

Prices may not be changed after entry, and should represent the retail price of the framed work. Please note that RAM collects a 40% commission on works that are for sale. If your entry is not for sale (NFS), please include an insurance value.

Insurance and Liability

Entries will be handled with care, but RAM is not responsible for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever before and during jurying. RAM assumes liability for works selected for exhibition.

Jurors

Tony Armendariz is a contemporary realist artist living and painting in Palatine, Illinois. His work focuses on figurative subjects rendered in watercolor. Armendariz has won numerous awards in regional and national competitions and has exhibited his work in many group and solo exhibitions. Armendariz is a signature member of many national societies, including the American Watercolor Society and the Illinois Watercolor Society, where he also served as director. Shelley Gilchrist is an abstract artist based in Evanston, Illinois, working in two and three dimensions in a variety of media, including acrylic. In 2006, her work turned toward abstraction when she began to shape her painting surfaces and explore line and color in her designs. Gilchrist has juried shows at Woman Made Gallery and ARC Gallery in Chicago. Gilchrist is a member of Chicago Sculpture International and the founder of FUSEDChicago, a professional group for artists using encaustic.

Awards

The following prizes will be awarded:

- The jurors select recipients for \$400 First Award, \$300 Second Award, \$200 Third Award, three \$100 Merit Awards, and multiple Merchandise Awards.
- Each year, RAM purchases work from this exhibition for the permanent collection. Artists willing to accept the standard amounts of \$300, \$500, and \$800—even when their retail price is higher—should check the appropriate box on the Registration Card. RAM also reserves the right to choose to purchase works at 60% of their retail price when the net amount to the artist is less than the three standard award amounts.
