### RAM's Wustum Museum of Fine Arts Hosts 46th Year of Watercolor Wisconsin

Racine, WI December 5, 2012

On December 9, 2012, RAM's Charles A. Wustum Museum of Fine Arts continues a longstanding Racine tradition with the opening of *Watercolor Wisconsin 2012*. As one of the museum's most popular annual shows, this exhibition brings together the works of artists from throughout the state. Featuring 119 pieces by 86 artists from communities in all corners of Wisconsin, this year's show will be on view at RAM's Wustum Museum through April 27, 2013.

Organized by the museum since 1966, *Watercolor Wisconsin* exhibitions have established RAM's Wustum Museum as a center for watercolor activity in the Midwest. Encouraged to experiment and explore all the possibilities of painting on paper, the artists in the show have created works as diverse as their own imaginations. Online entry has continued to expand the diversity of cities represented. *Watercolor Wisconsin 2012* includes artists from as near as downtown Racine, and as far as Lac du Flambeau, with growing numbers from the Madison and Milwaukee areas.

Of 287 pieces submitted by 163 artists, approximately one-third of the pieces were chosen for this year's show. Three new works from this year's competition will be purchased for the Racine Art Museum's permanent collection, adding to RAM's holdings of extraordinary Wisconsin artists. The museum's Curator of Collections makes these choices. Cash and merchandise prizes will also be awarded on December 9 to the artists whose pieces are selected as the best in the show by the jurors.

Experts from outside the state jury each annual competition, selecting the works to be included, as well as the awards. Richard A. Born and Jessica J. Caddell chose the 119 pieces by 86 Wisconsin artists that are represented in *Watercolor Wisconsin 2012*. Born is senior curator at The David and Alfred Smart Museum of Art, The University of Chicago in Chicago, Illinois. During the four decades of his career, Born has supervised the conception, organization, implementation and installation of more than 110 loan, touring, or permanent collection exhibitions. Caddell is executive director at the Freeport Art Museum in Freeport, Illinois. Previously, Caddell served as curator at the Rockford Art Museum in Rockford, Illinois.

The opening reception for *Watercolor Wisconsin 2012* will be held at RAM's Wustum Museum of Fine Arts on Sunday, December 9 from 2:00 to 4:00 pm. During the reception, Bruce W. Pepich, Executive Director and Curator of Collections will host the awards presentation beginning at 2:30 pm. Refreshments will be served.

Together, the two campuses of the Racine Art Museum, RAM in downtown Racine at 441 Main Street and the Charles A. Wustum Museum of Fine Arts at 2519 Northwestern Avenue, seek to elevate the stature of contemporary crafts to that of fine art by exhibiting significant works in craft media with painting, sculpture and photography, while providing outstanding educational art programming.

Docent led contemporary craft and architectural tours of the museums are available.
