

## Music fest returns to UW-Parkside

This year's festival began June 6 and runs through the 19th, with 16 composers and 22 instrumentalists participating, along with members of 5HE and composers in residence Dan Visconti and Stacy Garrop.

Fresh Inc.'s 2016 public performances opened Wednesday, with a noon

performance at the Milwaukee Art Museum, and will continue with a performance at the Kenosha Public Library's Southwest branch, 7979 38th Ave., at 2 p.m. on Saturday, June 11. Their performance at the Racine Public Library, 75 Seventh St., will be at 1:30 p.m. on Tuesday, June 14. And, on Thursday, June 16, they will perform at the Racine Family YMCA, 725 Lake Ave, at 9:30 a.m. All three are free shows.

The festival will close out its 2016 run with two final concerts, featuring 16 world premieres of pieces written for the festival by participating composers. One will be at Chicago's Roosevelt University on June 18 (\$15), and the other will be at UW-Parkside's Bedford Concert Hall, at 2 p.m. on Sunday, June 19. The UW-Parkside concert is free and will be followed by a reception, all in the Rita Tallent Picken Regional Center for Arts and Humanities, 900 Wood Road, Somers.
